TEAM MANAGER CODE OF CONDUCT

Team Managers agree to:

- Make every effort to support their players in the development of their sporting ability.
- Ensure that all training sessions and matches are inclusive for all players.
- Prioritise the wellbeing, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything.
- Have a positive relationship with their players, parents/guardians, and match officials.
- Give positive support and encouragement to their players at matches.
- Report any serious injuries or incidents to the club Welfare Officer.
- Respect any decision made by match officials.
- Allow their players to play competitively but fairly, and in-line with the Laws of the Game.
- Respect all players, match officials, managers, coaches and parents.
- Accept that mistakes happen and that nobody is perfect.
- Encourage their players to accept responsibility for their behaviour and performance.
- Set a positive example for their players and promote fair play.
- Co-operate fully with others in football, e.g. doctors, physiotherapists, welfare officers.

Team Managers agree not to:

- Exhibit bad, violent or threatening behaviour at matches or training sessions.
- Use any foul, abusive or hateful language at any match, training session or club event.
- Bully, harass or belittle any other player, parent, manager, coach or match official.

Spond & WhatsApp:

Team managers will be required to use Spond to manage their team's players, training sessions and match fixtures to allow the club to manage its fixtures and finances accurately and effectively. A WhatsApp group within the club's WhatsApp Community will be used for their team's parents, managers and coaches to discuss team-specific matters.

Any manager found guilty of misconduct may be required to appear before a disciplinary committee of the club or attend a meeting with the league. This includes when additional penalties are incurred, such as being sent off or cautioned. Managers are responsible for reimbursing the club for any fines that are issued against them by the league or a referee.
